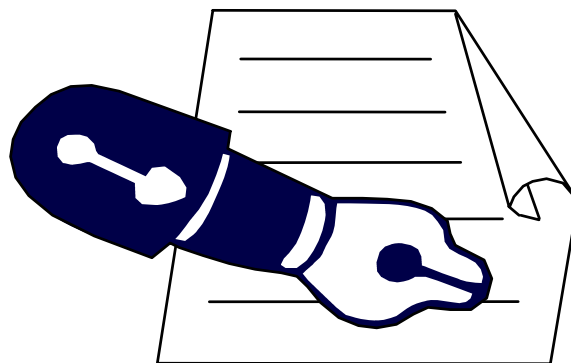

Decision makers use negotiation in a variety of circumstances - collective bargaining, negotiating out of court settlements, resolving conflicting interests within or across firms, agreeing on a purchase price for a good, and many other instances. The major goals of the course are, firstly, to understand the process of negotiations and how the structure of the negotiations process affects the outcomes achieved; secondly, to establish a framework for analyzing various types of negotiations, such as hard negotiation, soft negotiation, and principled negotiation; and thirdly, to design, implement, and evaluate dispute resolution practices through many cases.
